Czerne Reid is the health and science reporter at The State newspaper in Columbia, South Carolina, where she has been since 2004.

She was named a 2007/2008 Kaiser Media Fellow by the Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation. Her fellowship work focused on the economic and social impact of HIV/AIDS in South Carolina.

In summer of 2004, Czerne was a Kaiser Health Reporting Intern at the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel. Before that, she interned at The Salinas Californian, Stanford University News Service and Stanford Medical Center Office of Communication and Public Affairs.

Czerne earned a Ph.D. in environmental chemistry at Emory University, and a graduate certificate in science writing at the University of California, Santa Cruz. Her bachelor's degree in chemistry is from the University of the West Indies in her native Jamaica.
