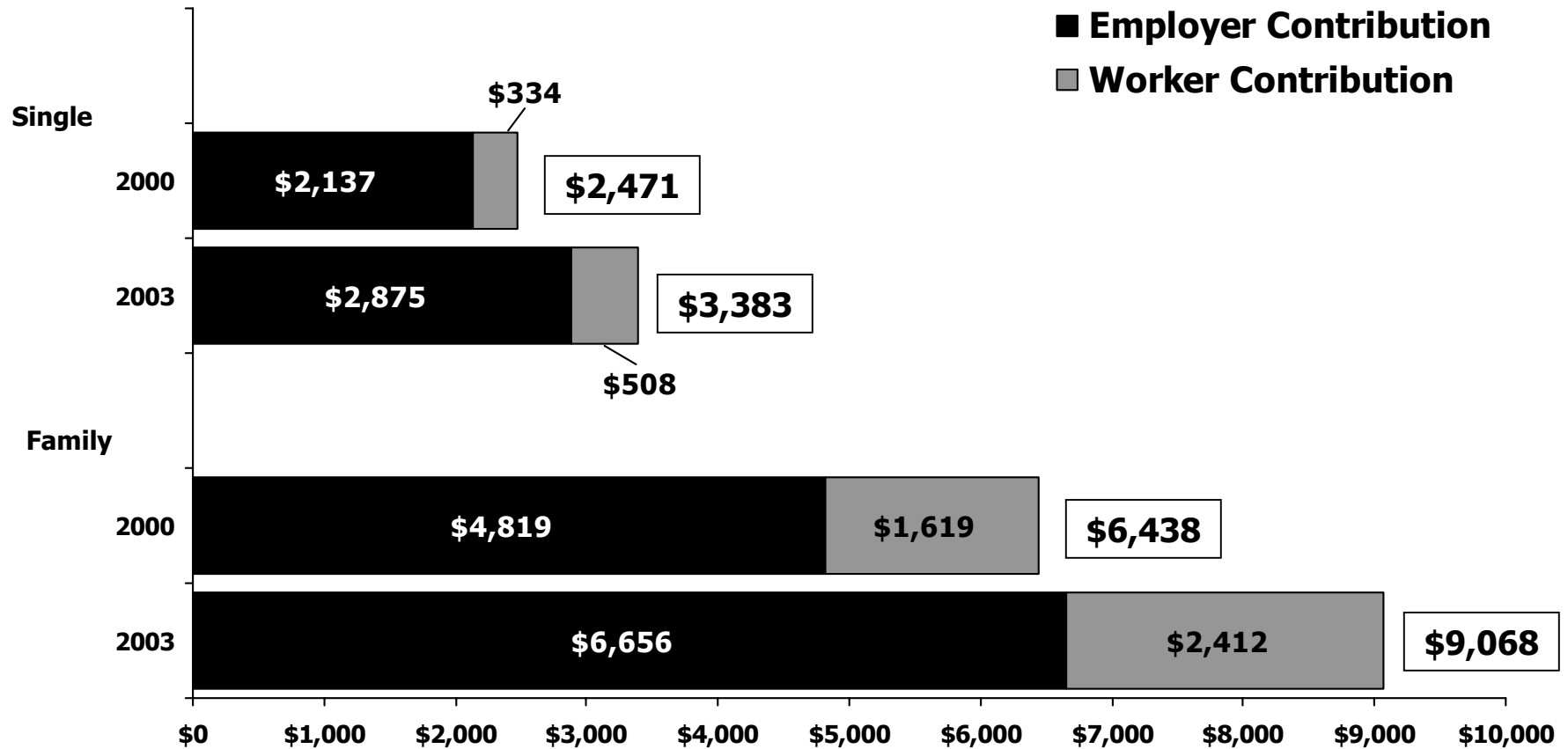

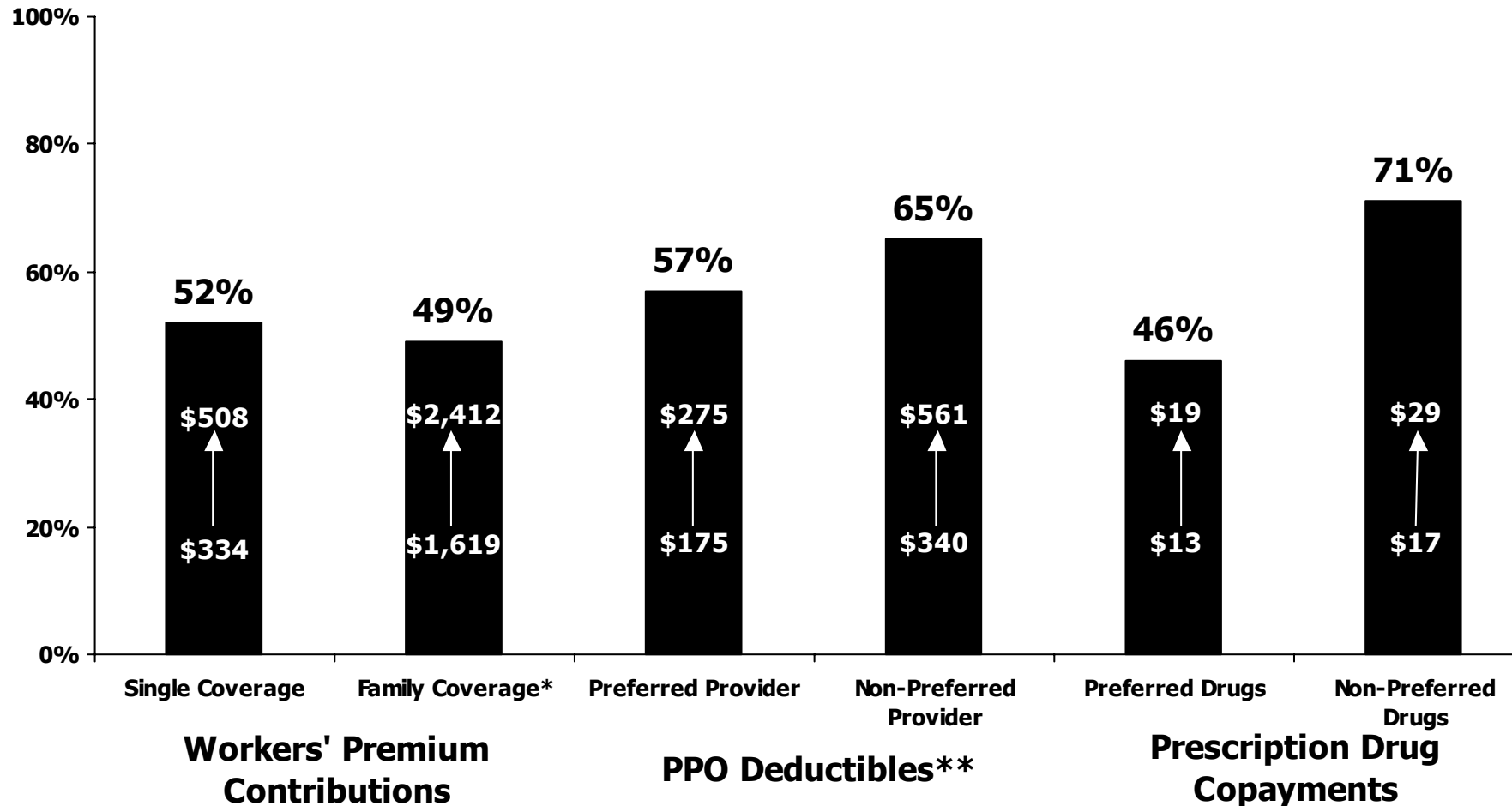
Average Annual Premium Costs for Covered Workers, 2000 and 2003

Increases In Workers' Out-of-Pocket Costs Between 2000 and 2003

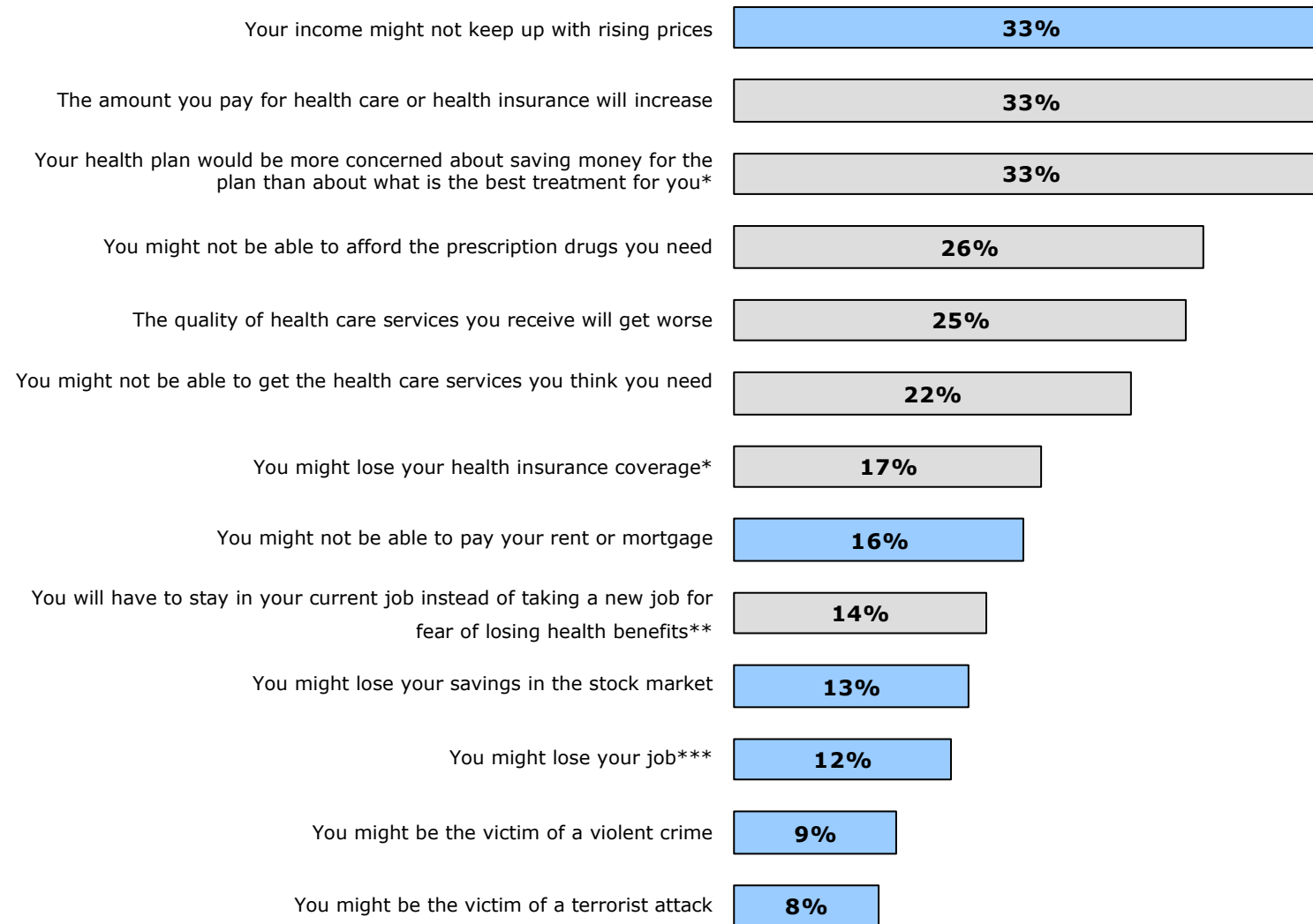

Percent saying "very worried"

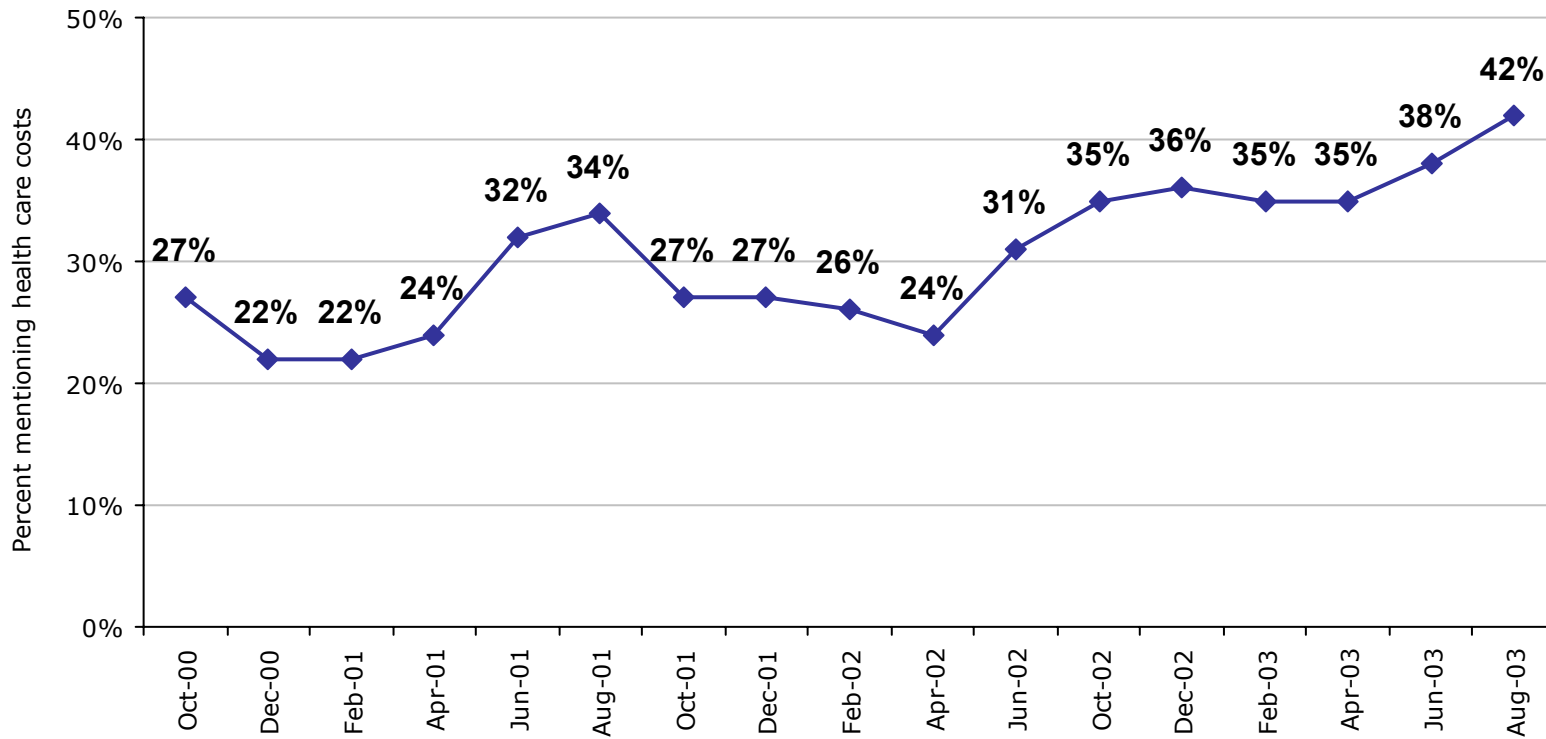
