Lucy Danziger

Lucy Danziger is editor-in-chief of *SELF* magazine – the premiere healthy lifestyle magazine for women with a readership of over 4 million. Under Ms. Danziger's editorship, *SELF* has been nominated for two National Magazine Awards. In 2003, *SELF* was nominated for the article, *I Gave up my Breasts to Save my Life*, by Lauren Slater; and in 2002 for, *The Big Fat Problem*, an article on the obesity epidemic in the United States. Before joining *SELF*, Ms. Danziger was the founding editor of *Women's Sports & Fitness*, which was nominated by The American Society of Magazine Editors for a National Magazine Award in the Special Interest Category in 1998. Ms. Danziger has had an extensive editing and writing career – her articles have appeared in *The New York Times*, *Vogue*, *Outside*, *Condé Nast Traveler*, *Skiing*, *Allure*, and *New Woman*, among others. She has also appeared on many television broadcasts, including NBC News *Today*, *Good Morning America*, *Charlie Rose*, and the nightly news broadcasts of CNN and NBC.

Tina Hoff is a Vice President for the Kaiser Family Foundation directing the Program on Entertainment Media Partnerships. She directs the Foundation's public education partnerships with leading networks and other media organizations, including Viacom, MTV, CBS, Nickelodeon, Univision, BET, as well as *SELF*, *seventeen*, *Glamour*, *Essence* and *Latina* magazines. At the Foundation, Ms. Hoff has also led several large research projects including a landmark study examining *Sex Education in America: A View from Inside the Nation's Classrooms*, a series of national surveys with educators, parents, and students about public secondary school sex education, as well as studies about public service advertising and public health knowledge and behaviors. Ms. Hoff joined the Foundation in 1994.

Hilda Hutcherson, MD

Dr. Hutcherson is an Associate Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology and the Associate Dean for Diversity and Minority Affairs at Columbia University's College of Physicians and Surgeons. She is also Co-Director of the New York Center for Women's Sexual Health at Columbia, where she is active in research on women's sexual issues. She recently authored a best-selling book, *What Your Mother Never Told You About Sex*, that has been featured on *Oprah* and in the pages of *Cosmo*, *Glamour*, *Marie Claire*, *Essence*, *Ebony*, *Allure*, *SELF*, and *health* magazine, among others. Her words of sexual wisdom appear monthly in her new sex column in *Essence* magazine; she is also a featured expert on *Parents.com* and *Oprah.com*. Dr. Hutcherson received her medical degree from Harvard Medical School; she completed her internship in Internal Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco, and her residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center.

Dr. Vanessa E. Cullins is Vice President of Medical Affairs for Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA). She oversees the PPFA Nurse Practitioner Program, the multicenter trial network for clinical research, affiliate accreditation, medical service delivery access and expansion, medical product national contracting, and development of the PPFA Medical Standards and Guidelines. Prior to joining PPFA, Dr. Cullins served as Vice President and Medical Director of EngenderHealth (formerly AVSC International), where she managed a team of medical professionals in the New York City headquarters and field offices in more than 25 countries worldwide. Dr. Cullins has conducted clinical research in family planning and reproductive health and has written extensively in the field. Dr. Cullins is a board-certified obstetrician gynecologist who received her medical degree from Johns Hopkins School of Medicine; she also has an MPH from the School of Hygiene and Public Health at Johns Hopkins, and an MBA from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania.
