National Survey on Latinos in America

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The Washington Post/Kaiser Family Foundation/Harvard University Survey Project 1995-2000

The Washington Post/Kaiser Family Foundation/Harvard University Survey Project is a threeway partnership and an experiment in combining survey research and reporting to better inform the public. The *Post*, Kaiser, and Harvard jointly design and analyze surveys examining public knowledge, perceptions, and misperceptions on major issues. The *Post* then reports the results as well as facts to dispel myths and misperceptions. Our hope is that this project contributes to a better understanding of public knowledge on major issues facing the country as well as more effective efforts by the media to educate, inform, and engage citizens in national debates.

The first report released by the Kaiser Family Foundation, *The Four Americas: Government and Social Policy Through the Eye's of America's Multi-racial and Multi-ethnic Society*, expands on *The Washington Post*'s coverage of the first survey beginning on October 8, 1995. This survey focused on the perspectives of different racial and ethnic groups with regard to social policy and the role of government in America. The findings show the different perceptions that America's racial and ethnic groups have of the social and economic standing of the other groups. It also shows how white Americans' misperceptions regarding the social and economic realities facing African Americans relate directly to their views and opinions on public policies and aid to minorities.

The second survey, released by *The Washington Post* on Sunday, January 28, 1996, examines public understanding, perceptions and attitudes about the role of government. It sheds light on why Americans are so distrustful and cynical about the federal government and its ability to act effectively. In addition, a closer look at trust of other institutions as well as fellow Americans is undertaken.

The third survey, released by *The Washington Post* on Sunday, October 13, 1996, examines public understanding, assessments and attitudes about the economy and economic policy. In conjunction with the survey of Americans, a companion survey of 250 economists was also completed. The companion survey shows the differences in perceptions and attitudes of economists compared to the general public.

The fourth survey undertaking, presented by *The Washington Post* in a five part series, beginning Sunday, March 22, 1998, examines Americans' opinions, perceptions and attitudes regarding gender and interactions between the sexes. A series of five related surveys paint an up-to-date picture of gender issues in work place and on the home front, including sexual harassment, the division of household tasks, parenting roles, and the joys and challenges of marriage today.

The fifth set of surveys examines social and moral values and their role in Americans' outlook on politics and policy. Findings from these surveys appeared in a series of occasional articles in *The Washington Post* beginning on September 11, 1998. The goal of the surveys—and their presentation in a series of reflections on values in the public domain—is to shed light on the influence of values on discourse about social and health policy, party politics, and broader questions about the future of our nation.

This sixth survey, released by *The Washington Post* in a series of articles beginning on January 16, 2000, undertakes one of the most comprehensive looks at Latinos in America today. It examines Latino attitudes regarding values, politics, race relations and social policies and compares those attitudes to non-Latino whites and blacks. In addition it provides a closer look at

Latino immigrant perceptions of U.S. culture and their adoption of American customs. The large scope of the study allows for comparisons to be made between Latinos born in the U.S. to those born outside and among Latinos with different national backgrounds.

Methodology

The Washington Post/Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation/Harvard University National Survey on Latinos in America was conducted by telephone between June 30 and August 30, 1999. Fieldwork was conducted by International Communications Research. This was a study of a nationally representative sample of 4,614 adults, 18 years and older, including 2,417 Latinos and 2,197 non-Latinos. Among the non-Latinos were 1,802 non-Latino white adults and 285 non-Latino black adults. Respondents were selected at random. The margins of sampling error for each group are $\pm 2\%$ for total respondents, $\pm 2\%$ for Latinos, $\pm 2\%$ for non-Latino whites, and $\pm 6\%$ for non-Latino blacks.

Individuals were identified as "Latino" if they answered "yes" to the question "Are you, yourself of Hispanic or Latin origin or descent, such as Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, or some other Latin background?" Latino adults were interviewed in their choice of English or Spanish. Fifty-three percent of the Latino interviews were conducted predominantly in Spanish. The research was designed to capture the diversity of national backgrounds among Latino Americans. The study included interviews with 818 Mexicans, 318 Puerto Ricans, 312 Cubans, and 593 Central or South Americans. The final results were weighted to the national Latino population, so that nationalities are represented in their actual proportions (as estimated by the Census Bureau's Current Population Survey). The margins of sampling error for each Latino subgroup are $\pm 4\%$ for Mexicans, $\pm 6\%$ for Puerto Ricans, $\pm 6\%$ for Cubans, and $\pm 4\%$ for Central/South Americans. The margin of sampling error may be higher for some of the sub-groups noted in the analysis.

Representatives of *The Washington Post*, The Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation and Harvard University worked together to develop the survey questionnaire and analyze the results. All three sponsors are publishing independent summaries of the findings; each organization bears the sole responsibility for the work that appears under its name. The project team included Richard Morin, *The Washington Post* director of polling and Claudia Deane, assistant director of polling; Drew E. Altman, president of the Kaiser Family Foundation, Mollyann Brodie, vice president and director of public opinion and media research, and Kristin Kenyon, research associate; and Robert J. Blendon, professor of health policy and political analysis at the John F. Kennedy School of Government and the Harvard School of Public Health, and John M. Benson, deputy director of the Harvard Opinion Research Program in the Harvard School of Public Health. A team of outside academic experts also contributed to the project design, including Jorge Chapa, University of Texas at Austin; John Garcia, University of Arizona; Lisandro Perez, Florida International University; Belinda Reyes, Public Policy Institute of California; Clara Rodriguez, Fordham University; Silvio Torres-Saillant, City College of New York, and Ana Maria Arumi, formerly of the Kaiser Family Foundation.
