- Visit Dimbasa Community Health Centre for discussion of HIV/AIDS services and treatment in poor rural environment
- Visit local households for discussion with community members about HIV/AIDS and other issues
- Meet with "grannies" participating in loveLife HIV/AIDS education and support programs

- Arrive Cape Town and check into Table Bay Hotel
