




Ebola Outbreak in West Africa – Distribution of Cases






Ebola Outbreak in West Africa – Distribution of Resources





The U.S. Government Response: Key Agencies and Roles

U.S. Agency for International Development

- Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance: coordinates U.S. disaster response on the ground
- Bureau for Global Health: provides operational and personnel support

Department of Defense

Provides technical and personnel support; conducts research on drug and vaccine development;
 will set up Joint Force Command to build clinics, provide training, and coordinate logistics

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

Provides technical and personnel support, and activates Emergency Operations Center

National Institutes of Health

Conducts research on drug and vaccine development

Department of Health and Human Services

 Funds drug and vaccine development through its Biomedical Advanced Research and Development Authority (BARDA)

Food and Drug Administration

Regulates drug and vaccine development

State Department

Coordinates diplomatic response and public education
