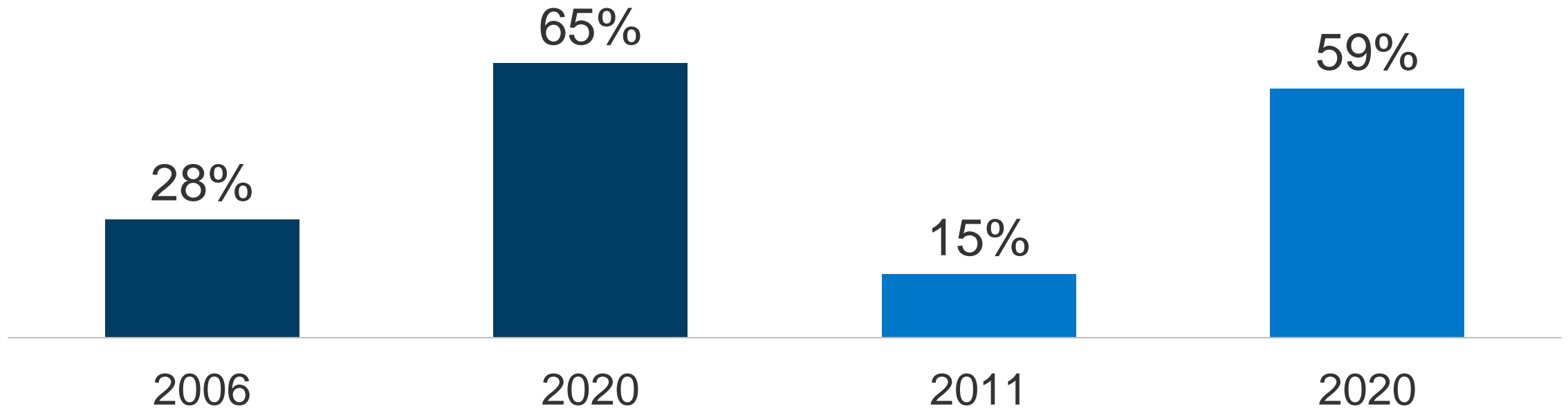

Share of Black women who say it is a **bad time to be a Black woman** in America

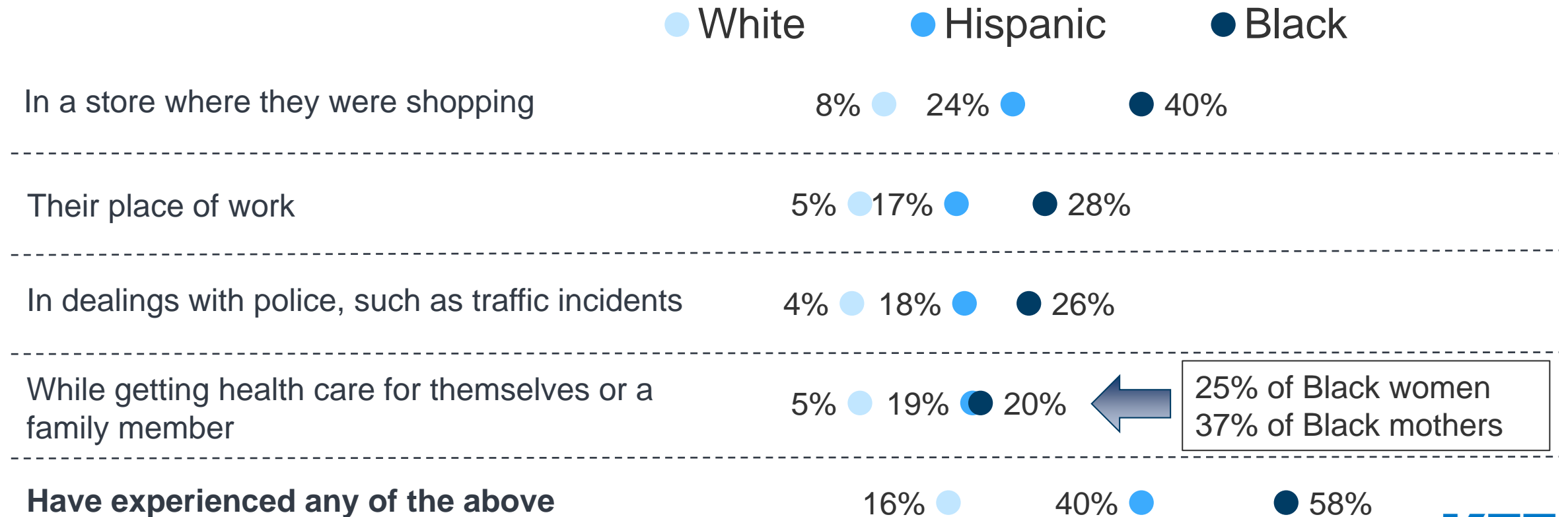

Percent who say there was a time in the last 12 months where they felt **they were treated unfairly** in the following places **because of their race or ethnic background**:



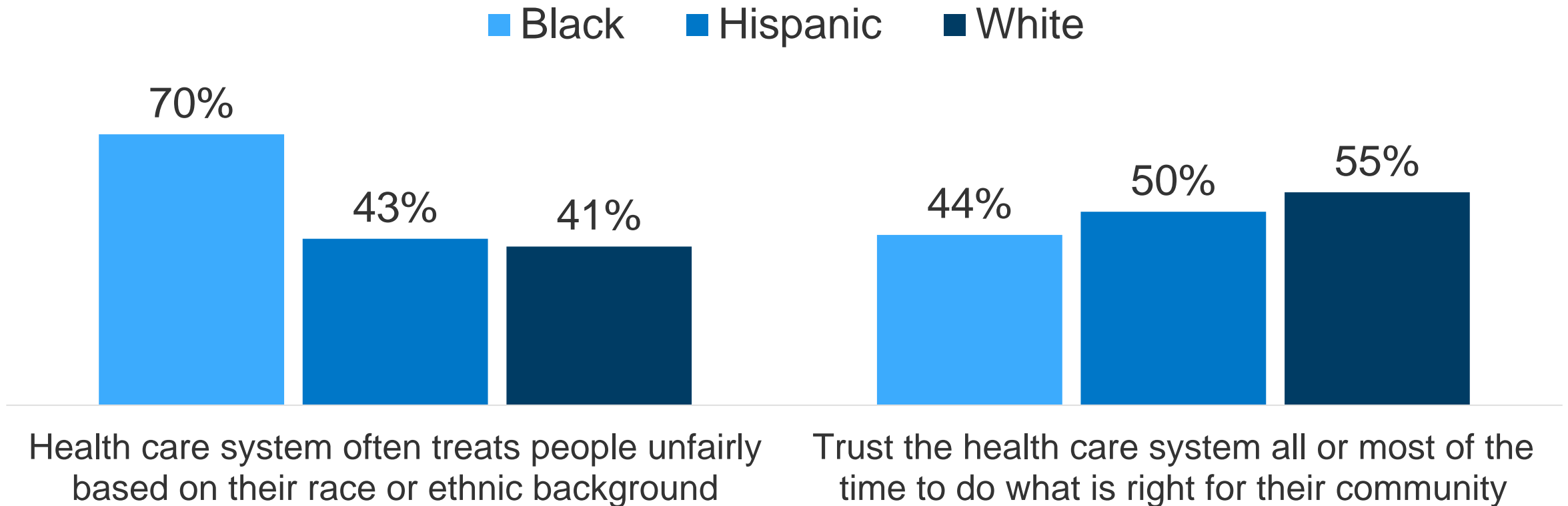

Percent of adults reporting perceptions of unfair treatment and trust in the health care system:

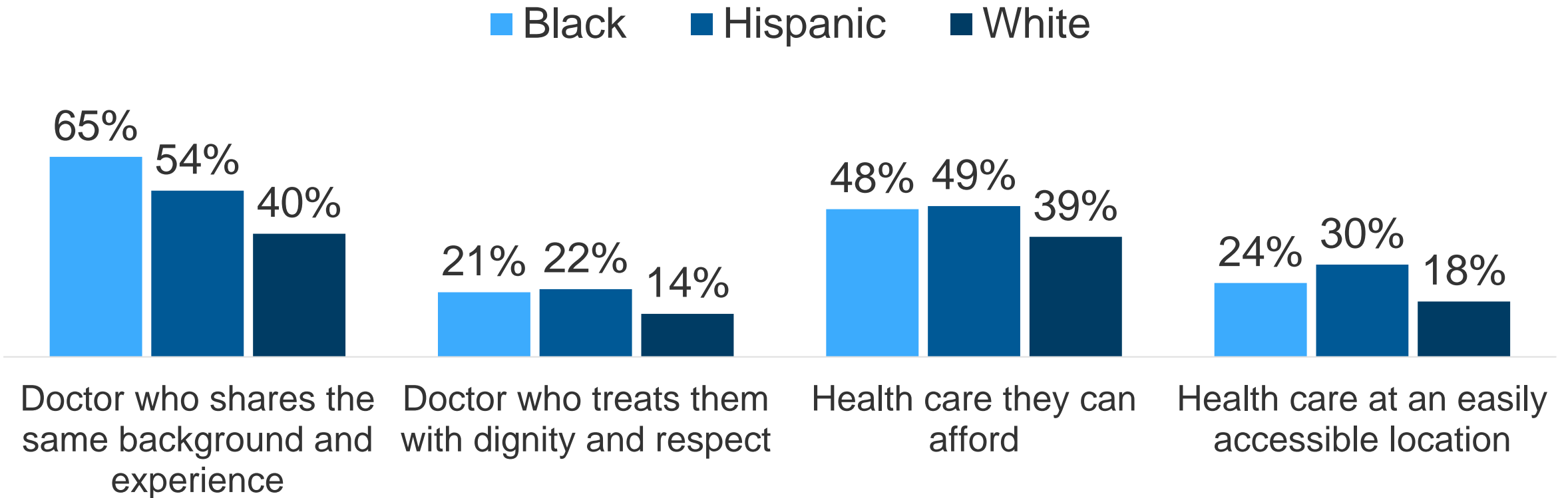

Percent of adults who say it is **difficult** to find each of the following:

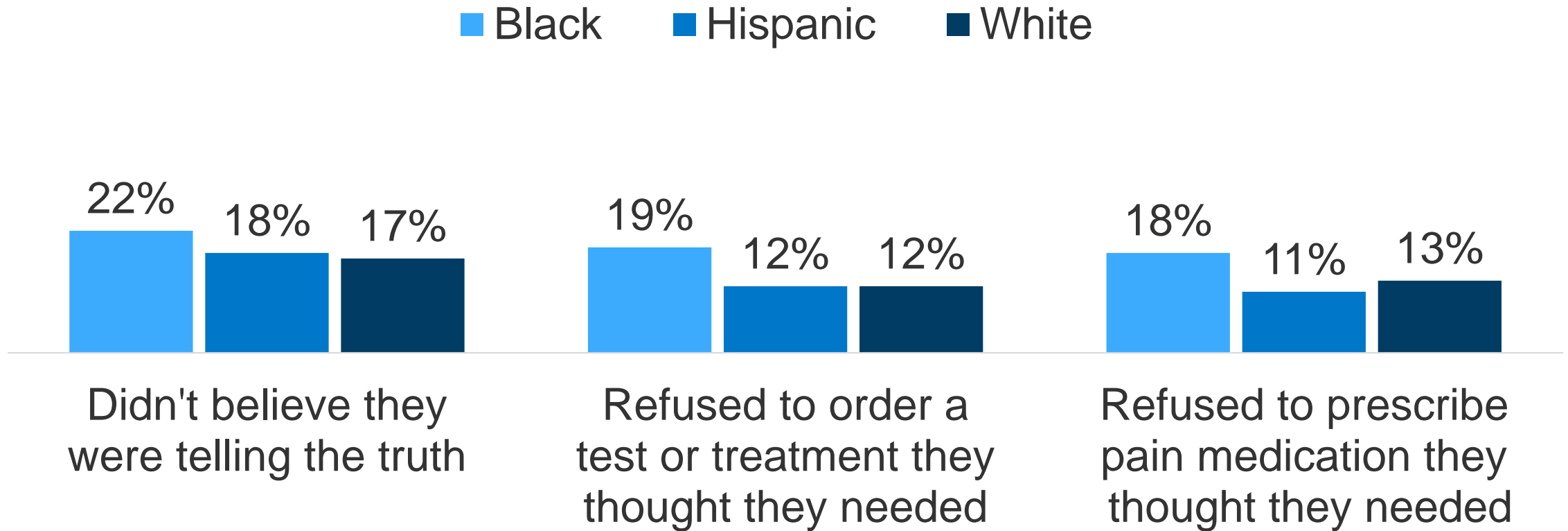

Percent who say they had each of the following experiences with a health care provider in the past 3 years:



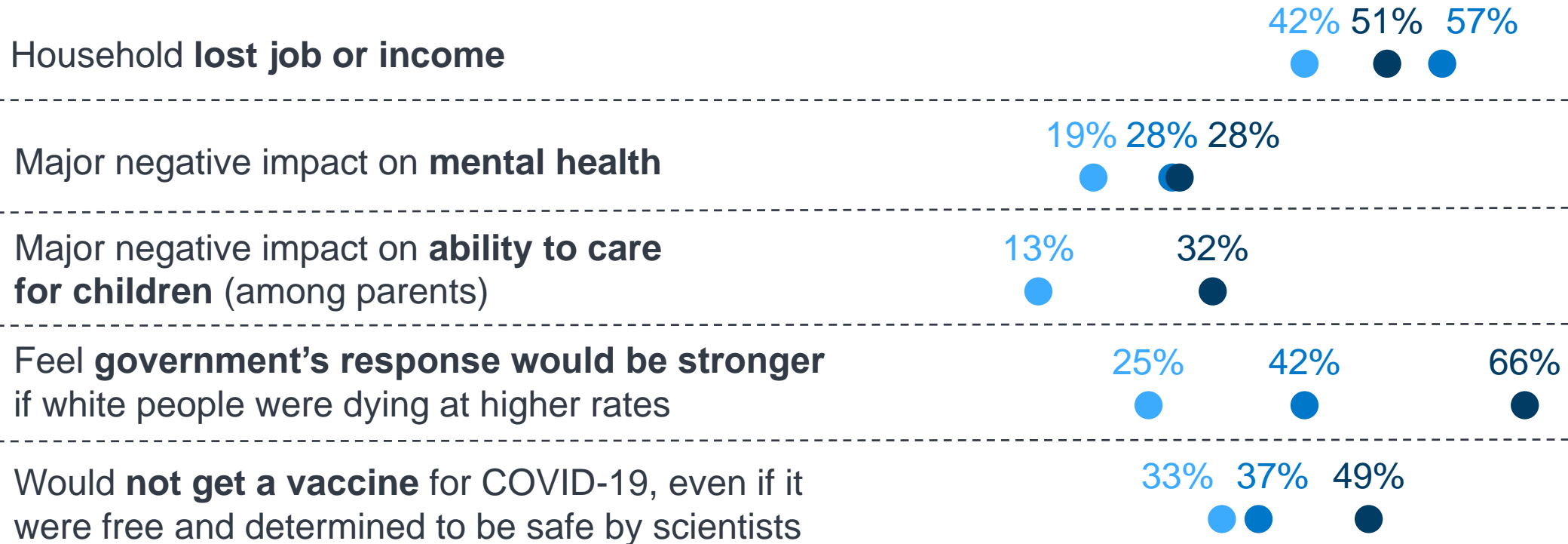
