INTRODUCTION

Across the States 2012: Profiles of Long-Term Services and Supports is the ninth edition of the AARP Public Policy Institute's state long-term services and supports reference report.

Published for the past 18 years, the *Across the States* series was developed to help inform policy discussions among public and private sector leaders in long-term services and supports throughout the United States. *Across the States 2012* presents comparable state-level and national data for more than 140 indicators, drawn together from a wide variety of sources into a single reference. This publication presents up-to-date data and is displayed in easy-to-use maps, graphics, tables, and state profiles.

Across the States 2012 comes in two volumes:

- A full report with an overview of key findings and trends, maps and graphs, and individual profiles for each state, the District of Columbia, and the nation as a whole. The full report provides a comprehensive picture of long-term services and supports in each state.
- An executive summary with an overview of key findings and trends, and ranking tables for each indicator, such as percentage of Medicaid long-term services and supports spending for older people and adults with physical disabilities going to home and community-based services. This permits readers to easily see variations among states.

Some of the indicators in *Across the States 2012* may be found in prior editions. Please exercise caution when making comparisons with information in earlier editions due to changes in the source or definition. Complete descriptions of all indicators, and how they may differ from previous editions, can be found in the Data Documentation section in the back of the full report. Data sources and descriptions of indicators are only found in the full report, not in the executive summary.

Additional indicators on health care spending, health status, and health care utilization for the age 50+ population can be found in another AARP Public Policy Institute report, *Quick Health Facts* 2010: Selected State Data on Older Americans.

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
OVERVIEW

Across the States 2012: Profiles of Long-Term Services and Supports focuses on comparative state data. Given the aging population, rising demand for long-term services and supports (LTSS), and increasing cost of services, consistent data across all states is essential to understand what is needed to improve the lives of those who need LTSS and their family caregivers. The following key findings were identified from the state and national data.

1:	The age 85 and older population—the age group most likely to need long-term services and supports—is growing at a dramatic rate.
2:	The older population is racially and ethnically diverse and is projected to become even more diverse as our multicultural society ages.
3:	Many older Americans live below 250 percent of the poverty line, and are likely to qualify for need-based long-term services and supports and other publicly funded services.
4:	Family caregivers provided \$450 billion worth of unpaid care in 2009, almost four times Medicaid long-term services and supports spending and nearly seven times what people paid privately.
5:	The bulk of Medicaid long-term services and supports dollars still go to nursing facilities rather than home and community-based services.
6:	The number of older people and adults with physical disabilities receiving Medicaid-funded home and community-based services has increased, while the number of nursing facility residents has remained constant.
7:	On average, Medicaid dollars can support roughly three people with home and community-based services for every person in an institution.
8:	At the state level, registered nurse hours per resident day are correlated with better nursing facility quality measures.
9:	The supply of assisted living units is catching up with the total number of nursing facility beds.

The age 85 and older population—the age group most likely to need long-term services and supports—is growing at a dramatic rate.

From 2012 to 2050, the population age 65 and older is projected to more than double, to 89 million. The 107 percent growth rate for the 65+ population is more than five times as fast as that of the age 50–64 population and almost twice as fast as that of the population under age 50.


A better barometer for the potential demand for long-term services and supports (LTSS) is the growth in the population age 85 and older, which is expected to increase by 69 percent between 2012 and 2032 and more than triple (+224%) between 2012 and 2050. People age 85 or older not only have much higher rates of disability, but they are also much more likely to be widowed and without someone to provide assistance with daily activities.

For the next 20 years (2012–2032), the population age 65–84 and the population age 85+ are projected to grow at similar rates (+75% and +69%, respectively). As the baby boomers begin to turn 85, however, the age 85+ population will grow dramatically while growth among those ages 65–84 will level off. Between 2032 and 2050, the age 85+ population will almost double (+92%), while the age 65–84 population will increase by only 6 percent.

In 2012, people age 85 or older make up only 2 percent of the U.S. population. The states with the highest percentage growth are **Florida** and **Hawaii**, with 3 percent each. In 2050, the national percentage is projected to be 4.8 percent, and all 50 states will exceed 3 percent, with only the **District of Columbia**, at 2.9 percent, falling shy of that mark. The age 85+ population is projected to more than quadruple in seven states between 2012 and 2050: **Alaska** (+650%), **Nevada** (+474%), **Georgia** (+375%), **Colorado** (+369%), **Utah** (+323%), **Texas** (+318%), and **Virginia** (+307%).

In 2010, one out of every five people age 65+ was nonwhite or Hispanic, a percentage that is increasing and will continue to do so in the future. By 2060, it is projected that 46 percent of the age 65+ population will be people of color.

The growing ethnic and racial diversity of the older population has enormous implications for meeting diverse LTSS preferences, addressing the role of paid and unpaid caregivers, providing services with cultural sensitivity, and training the paid LTSS workforce in cultural competence.

Aging populations of color outnumber whites in **Hawaii** (64% Asian/Pacific Islander), **Puerto Rico** (99% Hispanic), and the **District of Columbia** (62% black). In **New Mexico**, **California**, and **Texas**—the states with the highest proportion of Hispanics—more than 30 percent of people age 65+ are people of color.

This report not only highlights diversity in race and ethnicity among older adults, it also demonstrates great disparities related to poverty, education, disability, and living arrangements.

Poverty: Approximately 41 percent of people age 65 or older have incomes at or below 250 percent of poverty (about \$27,000 for a single person over age 65 or \$36,000 for a family of two), an income level that makes them financially vulnerable and unlikely to be able to pay for LTSS out-of-pocket.


Education: Level of education is one of the strongest predictors of LTSS need as well as of the economic capacity to pay for services. Those with college educations are less likely to need services and more likely to be able to pay for them. About one out of five (21%) people age 65 or older has a bachelor's degree or higher.

Disability: More than one-third (37%) of people age 65 or older have a sensory, physical, mobility, self-care, or cognitive disability that may affect their ability to accomplish common tasks of everyday living. Among the age 65+ population, 9 percent have self-care difficulty and 10 percent have cognitive difficulty, which are the most likely to result in need for LTSS.

Living Alone: One-third (34%) of people age 75 or older live alone, which means that there is no one in the household to provide assistance if they need help with daily activities. People living alone are more likely to have to move to a care facility if they need LTSS.

Many older Americans live below 250 percent of the poverty line, and are likely to qualify for need-based long-term services and supports and other publicly funded services.

Older people are less likely to be below the poverty line than younger and working-age people. However, the proportion of older people who have income below 250 percent of the poverty line ¹ is much higher than for the working-age population. The percentage of Americans living below 250 percent of the poverty line is as high for the age 85+ population, those most likely to need LTSS, as it is for the age 0–24 population. This will have significant ramifications in the future because of the increasing projected growth of the age 85+ population.

¹ 250 percent of the federal poverty level is slightly higher than 300 percent of Social Security Income, a moderate level of income under which older people and adults with disabilities can qualify for need-based LTSS and other publicly funded services in most states.

Annual Spending in Billions of Dollars




In the United States, 42 million caregivers were providing unpaid care to friends and family *at any given time* during 2009. They provided an average of 18.4 hours of care per week, at an average value of \$11.16 per hour.

Although Medicaid is the largest payer of LTSS, family caregivers are the foundation of the LTSS system. The estimated economic value of contributions was \$450 billion in 2009, almost four times as much as total Medicaid LTSS spending and almost seven times the amount of privately paid LTSS and home health care. The estimated economic value of family caregiving exceeded Medicaid LTSS spending in every state. ²

Family caregivers provide personal care and help with everyday tasks as well as health-related interventions such as administering complex medications. They help to contain health and LTSS costs by providing such care and can even delay or prevent the use of more expensive hospital and nursing home care. Although family caregivers usually undertake these tasks willingly, they often experience high levels of emotional, physical and financial stress. Many of them juggle employment with caregiving responsibilities.


States Exceeding Federal Requirements for Family and Medical Leave Acts for Adults, 2008



The federal Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 (FMLA) allows covered employees to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave to care for a family member with a serious health condition. States can help adults and family caregivers by exceeding the minimum FMLA requirements—by broadening the range of employers that must comply with the requirements, extending the coverage period beyond 12 weeks, and broadening the definition of "family member." In 2008, 14 states exceeded the federal minimum FMLA requirements for adults.

Medicaid Long-Term Services and Supports Spending for Older People and Adults with Physical Disabilities in the United States, 2009




Medicaid is the primary payer of formal LTSS in the United States (46% in 2009). Almost two-thirds (64%) of Medicaid LTSS dollars for older people and adults with physical disabilities went to nursing facility care, even though most people prefer to live at home or in their communities. Medicaid nursing facility spending was \$51.4 billion, compared to \$28.7 billion for home and community-based services (HCBS) for older people and adults with physical disabilities.

Nursing facility care is a mandatory entitlement within the Medicaid program. All individuals who qualify financially for Medicaid and qualify by level of disability for nursing facility care must be allowed to receive nursing facility services. Most HCBS are optional; although all states have mechanisms for providing home and community alternatives to nursing homes, Medicaid-eligible older people and adults with disabilities are not necessarily entitled to such services.

All state Medicaid programs in the U.S. cover optional HCBS through federal waivers. Also, many states cover personal care services for adults in the home under their Medicaid state plans.

There is great state variation in the funding of Medicaid HCBS. In 2009, the percentage of Medicaid LTSS funds for older adults and adults with physical disabilities going toward HCBS ranged from 10 percent to 65 percent.

Medicaid HCBS Spending as Percentage of LTSS Spending, for Older People and Adults with Physical Disabilities, 2009




Only seven states—New Mexico, Washington, Minnesota, Oregon, Alaska, California, and Texas—and the District of Columbia spent more than 45 percent of their Medicaid LTSS funds on HCBS. On the other end of the range, six states—North Dakota, Delaware, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Alabama, and Maryland—spent 15 percent or less on HCBS.

Although small compared with Medicaid budgets, non-Medicaid state-funded programs are another source of HCBS public funding. In 2009, state-only HCBS funding totaled \$1.5 billion (about 5% of the amount of Medicaid HCBS expenditures) but was significant in several states. State-funded HCBS programs often serve people who are not Medicaid eligible but are at risk of institutionalization. ³


Most people with LTSS needs do not live in institutions such as nursing facilities. Most live in their own home, and receive LTSS at home or in their community. There are a wide variety of home and community-based services and supports that can enable people to live as independently as possible. These include personal care, where an aide can help with daily activities; assisted living, which is licensed, supportive group housing usually including meals and assistance with daily activities for people who would otherwise not be able to live in their own homes; adult day services provided in a senior center or other group setting, and many others.

The number of older people and adults with physical disabilities receiving HCBS is increasing at a greater rate than the number of people living in nursing facilities. The number of older people and adults with physical disabilities receiving Medicaid HCBS (including those receiving home health services) increased 18 percent from 2003 to 2008, to a total of 2.5 million Medicaid beneficiaries receiving these services. ⁴

From 2003 to 2008, the number of people using Medicaid nursing services actually declined 4 percent, from about 1.7 million to 1.6 million. During the same five-year period, the number of nursing facility residents (all payment sources) also declined slightly from 1.5 million to 1.4 million. ⁵



Across all states, Medicaid HCBS expenditures increased by 70 percent from 2004 to 2009, while Medicaid expenditures for nursing facilities increased by just 12 percent. Nevertheless, total nursing facility expenditures remained nearly twice as high as HCBS expenditures. From 2004 to 2009, all states except **Maryland** and **Mississippi** increased Medicaid HCBS expenditures. The largest percentage increases in expenditures were in the **District of Columbia**, **Louisiana**, **Virginia**, and **Minnesota**, all of which increased HCBS spending by more than 150 percent during the five-year period.

Medicaid Long-Term Services and Supports Spending per Person Served, by Service, 2008




The need for LTSS is associated with growing old. However, people of all ages need LTSS. The services and supports needed by these populations—older people, adults with physical disabilities, adults with intellectual disabilities, and others—as well as the costs of these services and supports, are very different. However, for all populations, the typical cost of HCBS is about one-third the cost of institutional care.

Per person, nursing facility services are almost three times as costly as HCBS for older people and adults with disabilities. In 2008, Medicaid spending for HCBS—waiver and state plan personal care services (PCS)—for each older person and adult with physical disabilities receiving services averaged \$10,957, compared with \$29,533 for each person receiving services in a nursing facility. Home health care, which is often used for short-term post-acute care, averaged \$5,495 per person served.

Likewise, for people with intellectual disabilities, the cost of institutional services in an Intermediate Care Facility-Mental Retardation (ICF-MR) averaged \$123,053 per person, nearly three times the average cost of HCBS (\$42,896). States have been shifting Medicaid resources toward HCBS to "balance" Medicaid LTSS spending. In general, states are further ahead in their efforts to deinstitutionalize by closing ICF-MRs and serving more people with intellectual disabilities in the community.

At the state level, registered nurse hours per resident day are correlated with better nursing facility quality measures.




The number of direct care registered nurse (RN) hours per resident day correlates strongly with incidence of pressure sores, use of physical restraints, and hospital admissions. States with more direct care RN hours tended to have lower rates of pressure sores, lower use of restraints, and fewer hospital admissions. On average, in 2010, nursing facility residents received 3.8 hours of direct nursing care per day, of which 0.64 were RN hours.

The states with the most RN hours per resident day are **Alaska** (for which quality data were not available because of the small number of nursing facilities in the state), **Hawaii**, **Washington**, **Delaware**, **Montana**, and **Utah**. These states performed better than the national average in all three quality indicators included in the state profiles (pressure sores, use of restraints, and hospital admissions), except for Utah on its use of physical restraints.

North Dakota, Hawaii, Minnesota, and Nebraska have the lowest rates of pressure sores. Kansas, Nebraska, and Wisconsin have the lowest rates of use of physical restraints. Minnesota, Utah, Arizona, and Oregon have the lowest rates of hospital admissions.

Assisted Living and Nursing Home Supply, 2007 - 2010




Depending upon state licensure requirements, assisted living can include a variety of residential care settings, such as adult foster care and personal care homes. Assisted living generally offers services that provide assistance with activities of daily living and instrumental activities of daily living to people in a residential setting.

Over the past few years, there has been a dramatic increase in the number of assisted living units across the United States. From 2007 to 2010, supply has increased almost 18 percent, from a total capacity of 1,046,631 units to 1,233,690 units. ⁶ During the same period, nursing facility bed supply remained constant at about 1.7 million beds. This trend demonstrates consumer preferences for alternatives to nursing facilities.

There is almost a sixfold difference in the average supply of assisted living units between the highest five and lowest five states. The average supply in the five highest states (**Minnesota**, **Oregon**, **Idaho**, **Wisconsin**, and **Washington**) was 62 units per 1,000 people age 65 or older in the state, compared with 11 units in the five lowest states (**District of Columbia**, **Louisiana**, **West Virginia**, **Mississippi**, and **Nevada**). The national average is 31 units.

State Variation in Assisted Living Supply



Assisted living facilities are predominantly private pay, while nursing facilities are largely funded by Medicaid. Only about one-fifth (19%) of assisted living residents have the cost of services covered by Medicaid, compared with almost two-thirds (63%) of nursing facility residents. The national average annual private pay rate for an assisted living unit (\$39,135) was slightly more than one-half the cost of a semiprivate room in a nursing facility (\$70,445).


Conclusion




Percent of Population Age 85+, 2012




Percent of Population Age 85+, 2032 (projected)




Percent of Population Age 85+, 2050 (projected)




People of Color, Percent of Age 65+ Population, 2010




Medicaid HCBS Spending as Percentage of LTSS Spending, for Older People and Adults with Physical Disabilities, 2009




Medicaid HCBS Spending as Percentage of LTSS Spending, for All Populations, 2009




Medicaid HCBS Beneficiaries as Percentage of LTSS Users, for Older People and Adults with Physical Disabilities, 2008




Medicaid HCBS Beneficiaries as Percentage of LTSS Users, for All Populations, 2008




Annual Cost of Care for Semi-Private Room in a Nursing Facility, 2011




Annual Cost of Home Care (30 Hours per Week), 2011




Annual Cost of Assisted Living, 2011




Private Long-Term Care Insurance Policies in Effect per 1,000 Population Age 40+, 2010




Medicaid Presumptive Eligibility for HCBS, 2010




States With or Planning to Implement Medicaid Managed LTSS




States Exceeding Federal Requirements for Family and Medical Leave Acts for Adults, 2008




Percentage of State Population in ADRC Coverage Area, June 2012

Medicaid Community Spouse Asset Protection: Allowable Asset Standards, 2009






Percent of Long-Stay Nursing Facility Residents with Physical Restraints, 2008




Percent of High Risk Nursing Facility Residents with Pressure Sores, 2008




Percent of Long-Stay Nursing Facility Residents with a Hospital Admission, 2008




Percent of Home Health Patients with a Hospital Admission, 2008




Nursing Facility Staffing Turnover Rate, 2010




Percent of Nursing Facilities that are For-Profit, 2010









Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service





























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



Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service





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













Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service



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





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

Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service



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







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





Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service







Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service







Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service









Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service









Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service











Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service















Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service



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





Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service





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



Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service



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



Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service



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







Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service









Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service













Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service













Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service








Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service

Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service









Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service











Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service









Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service













Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service








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

Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service

















Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service








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

















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

Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service



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



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











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

Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service



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























Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service



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



Percent Change in Medicaid LTSS Spending, 2004–2009, by Service





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



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
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
