An act to add Article 6.3 (commencing with Section 14197) to Chapter 7 of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to vaccinations.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1117, as amended, Cristina Garcia. Medi-Cal: vaccination rates. Existing law provides for the Medi-Cal program, which is administered by the State Department of Health Care Services, under which qualified low-income individuals receive health care services. The Medi-Cal program is, in part, governed and funded by federal Medicaid Program provisions. Existing law requires each county to establish a community child health and disability prevention program to include, among other things, health screening and evaluation services for all children that include immunizations and an assessment of immunization status.

This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to improve vaccination rates for persons 2 years of age in Medi-Cal managed care. require the State Department of Health Care Services to establish and administer the California Childhood Immunization Quality Improvement Fund (CCIQIF) program to improve childhood immunization rates, and would require the department to submit an application to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for a waiver to implement a 5-year demonstration project to implement the program. The bill would require the department to develop a plan

for the collection and expenditure of CCIQIF moneys according to specified guidelines, including voluntary contributions from Medi-Cal managed care plans to be used for provider support payments and reward payments to Medi-Cal managed care plans, as specified. The bill would require the department to contract with specified researchers to develop and submit to the Legislature an evaluation of the effectiveness of the demonstration project. This bill would make these provisions inoperative on a specified date.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Article 6.3 (commencing with Section 14197) is 2 added to Chapter 7 of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Welfare and 3 Institutions Code, to read: 4 5 Article 6.3. California Childhood Immunization Quality 6 Improvement Fund (CCIQIF) Program 7 8 14197. (a) The Legislature finds and declares all of the 9 following: 10 (1) The 2014–15 outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases 11 threaten the health and safety of the California public. (2) Only 71 percent of young children in California between 12 13 the ages of 19 to 35 months are immunized, which is below the national average of 75 percent, according to 2010 data reported 14 15 by the Kaiser Family Foundation. (3) In 2013, 39,000 two year olds lacked one or more 16 17 recommended immunizations, according to the State Department 18 of Health Care Services. 19 (4) The social and direct economic costs of ensuring each child 20 receives the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Advisory 21 Committee for Immunization Practices recommended schedule for 22 vaccines far outweighs the costs of not providing routine 23 immunizations. It is estimated that for every \$1 spent on 24 vaccinations, as many as \$29 can be saved in direct and indirect 25 costs. 26 (5) California children are required to be fully vaccinated before 27 they enter kindergarten, with some exceptions. However, there are

no official requirements for younger children who are often more
 susceptible to dire consequences from vaccine-preventable
 diseases.

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4 (b) It is the intent of the Legislature, by enacting this chapter,
5 to ensure that all possible steps are taken to ensure that two year
6 old children who are enrolled in Medi-Cal managed care receive
7 all recommended immunizations.

8 14197.1. For purposes of this article, "Medi-Cal managed 9 care plan" means any prepaid health plan or Medi-Cal managed 10 care plan contracting with the department to provide services to 11 enrolled Medi-Cal beneficiaries under this chapter or Chapter 8

12 (commencing with Section 14200).

13 14197.2. (a) The department shall establish and administer
14 the California Childhood Immunization Quality Improvement Fund
15 (CCIQIF) program to improve childhood immunization rates.

(CCIQIF) program to improve chilahood immunization rates.
(b) (1) The department shall submit an application to the federal
Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for a waiver or
demonstration project to implement the CCIQIF program no later
than 120 days after the operative date of this article. The
department shall determine the form of waiver most appropriate

21 to achieve the purposes of this article.

(2) The demonstration project shall operate for a period of fiveyears.

(c) In developing the waiver or demonstration project
application, the department shall consult with interested
stakeholders, including the Medi-Cal Children's Health Advisory
Panel and the Managed Care Advisory Workgroup. The department
shall work with stakeholders to incorporate public comment into
the waiver or demonstration project application.

30 14197.3. The department shall develop a plan for the collection 31 and expenditure of CCIQIF moneys according to all of the 32 following guidelines:

33 (a) The CCIQIF program may be financed through voluntary

34 contributions from Medi-Cal managed care plans that shall be
 35 used to draw down federal financial participation consistent with

36 *federal law.*

37 (b) The department shall allocate 33.3 percent of CCIQIF

38 *expenditures for provider support payments to support providers*

39 in employing strategies to improve immunization rates in their

40 practices, which may include patient reminders, promotion of

colocation vaccination delivery with other services, and other 1

2 strategies as specified by the department after consideration of 3 public comment.

4 (c) (1) The department shall allocate 66.7 percent of CCIQIF 5 expenditures for reward payments to Medi-Cal managed care

6 plans. The rate of the reward shall be \$125 for each enrollee who

receives all recommended vaccinations by the time he or she 7

8 reaches two years of age, as determined by the Childhood

9 Immunization Status measure of the Healthcare Effectiveness Data

10 and Information Set (HEDIS).

(2) Any unearned reward payment expenditures shall roll over 11 12 to the subsequent demonstration project year. If all reward payment expenditures are earned within a demonstration project year, no 13 additional reward payments shall be distributed until the next 14 15 demonstration project year begins.

(d) At least 20 percent of the CCIQIF expenditures used for 16 17 reward payments pursuant to subdivision (c) shall be passed 18 through to contracted providers based on the number of Medi-Cal 19 enrollees who are under two years of age in each provider's 20 respective panel.

21 14197.4. (a) The department shall contract with the University 22 of California or any other researchers to develop and submit, in 23 compliance with Section 9795 of the Government Code, to the

Legislature an evaluation of the effectiveness of the demonstration 24

25 project using data collected from the first three years of the waiver

26 period or demonstration project. That evaluation shall be submitted 27 within the fourth year of the waiver period or demonstration 28 project.

29 (b) The evaluation shall, at a minimum, include an assessment 30 of the most effective administrative support strategies.

31 (c) The evaluation shall be financed with no more than five

32 percent of the total annual CCIQIF program expenditure dollars.

During the waiver or demonstration project year that the 33

34 evaluation is commissioned, CCIQIF provider support expenditures shall be reduced, commensurate with available funds, to offset the

35 36 cost of the evaluation contract.

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14197.5. This chapter shall be implemented only if and to the

38 extent that federal financial participation is available and any 39 necessary federal approvals have been obtained.

1 14197.6. (a) This chapter shall become inoperative on the 2 date that the Director of Health Care Services executes a 3 declaration, which shall be retained by the director, stating that 4 the demonstration project has concluded, and shall, six months 5 after the date the declaration is executed, be repealed.

6 (b) In addition to the requirements specified in subdivision (a),

7 the director shall post the declaration on the department's Internet

8 Web site and the director shall send the declaration to the

9 appropriate policy committees of the Legislature and to the

10 Legislative Counsel.

11 SECTION 1. It is the intent of the Legislature to enact

12 legislation to improve vaccination rates for persons two years of

13 age in Medi-Cal managed care.

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
