

Percent who think most men need to play more of a role, less of a role, or play enough of a role in CHOOSING a method of contraception







Women and Men Say that Men Need to Play Bigger Role in Using Contraception


Percent who think most men need to play more of a role, less of a role, or play enough of a role in MAKING SURE contraception always is USED











Many Know Little about Contraceptive Choices


Percent of men who say they know a lot, some, a little, or nothing about the different types of contraceptive options available to couples

Percent who say they would consider sterilization



